live the rural setting of Cowra receive a first class education.


Congratulations to Nicola Carter one of Cowra High Schools talented and passionate Dancers. Nicola has been selected from over 400 candidates to perform at Call Back

Cowra High School is proud of you Nicola and we look forward to seeing you perform showcasing exceptional performance quality and love for the performing arts in February 2020.


The Night of Music on Thursday evening continues to allow students at CHS the exposure to perform in front of an



Thursday of week 8 was the Year 8 Wellbeing Day. Students worked their way through sessions on Cyber Safety, Healthy Relationships and Mindfulness. A big thank you to all staff and presenters involved who stepped in to make it such a successful day.

Our Director of Educational Leadership Mr David Lloyd visited the school on Monday this week and addressed the executive team. I took something very valuable but also shocking from part of our conversation. In discussing school attendance, Mr Lloyd pointed out that even if a student is attending regularly and achieving in the area of 85-90% attendance, over their schooling life, this still means they miss the equivalent of one whole year of formal schooling! This truly highlights the importance of students achieving the highest possible rate of attendance. If we look at it in these terms, students who have lower rates of attendance are potentially graduating from school at least one year behind their higher attending classmates... Very interesting and important food for thought I'm sure you'd agree.

As we draw close to the holidays, and with that in mind, I encourage all students to attend every day to maximise their true learning potential!




I like reading, shopping, going to cafés, singing, and talking!!

It is focused on closing the gap for all individuals, especially low socio-Economic and Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islanders students, aiming to raise student aspirations and levels of education. It's about encouraging those students who potentially have the ability to study further but perhaps not the motivation, aspiration, access or role models etc to help to do so. Students from various classes in Years 7-10 were given the opportunity to spend an hour with the CSU Future Moves team to explore many career pathways through a variety of activities. Stage 5 students were exposed to some pretty cool 3D Virtual experiences, while Stage 4 students got to play a mini version 'Game of Life' style game where they were given a job to earn a wage, had to budget, pay bills with banking all done on the iPad. All students thoroughly enjoyed the experience and were certainly keen to continue the discussion of career opportunities and the many pathways.
































Community News
