students from other rural high schools. Best of Luck Cowra High School.



Learning in SCIENCE

Stage 5 Engineering

This term Stage 5 Engineering have been learning about how electricity is generated. We have looked at the different renewable sources of energy and when they can be used. The students were tasked with designing an 'Off the

Grid' house that is able to produce its own electricity based on the location of their house. They needed to create a model of their house that showed all the important features that made it able to function without access to mains power or

water. The students have come up with some very good designs, both physical models and 3D models on the computer and have really engaged in the hands-on aspects of this task.

Agriculture

Recapping the terms events in Agriculture. Stage 4 have been busily preparing and planting vegetables, learning about the basics of sustainable farming and the joys of gardening. Some of the vege seeds have germinated and are poking the heads out of the ground. Stage 5 Agriculture has participated in the Cows Create Careers competition

with Dairy Australia enduring feeding, handling and cleaning of the calves. They are in the process of finalising their submissions for the competition and we are looking forward to the results. Adding to this we see the delivery of new bloodstock to our sheep flock, but more on that in the next issue.

Stage 6 are heading toward their final exams, completing product, plant and animal studies. Overall, they have put in a great effort and we wish them well in their upcoming exam, study well.

<u>Science</u>

Science is moving forward at great knots this term at CHS, Year 7 have studied Space and are

now working on Forces. Year 8 have completed Chemical reactions and are learning Applied Biology and diseases, current assessments on diseases should make for some interesting reading...

Chemistry for year 9 with Atomic Theory being the flavour at the start of term and now grasping the concepts of Electrical Circuits. Year 10 are also dealing with the complexity of Chemistry, acid-base reactions, precipitations and balancing equations, all necessary skills and concepts for those looking to Senior Sciences in 2020.



Stage 4 AES Science were tasked with planning their own mission to investigate something in space. They needed to plan the purpose of the mission and the design and build a prototype of the space equipment they would need for this mission. Last week the A2 class completed an egg drop challenge to investigate gravity and impact forces. They came up with some excellent designs for parachutes and found that a lot of padding to protect the egg from impact was the best way to keep the egg whole.





All About The Learning Hub




