I look forward to seeing you all at the Graduation Dinner celebrating the conclusion of you high school careers.

Congratulations to Megan McKenzie who was the winner of the P and C 3000 Club Draw. Thank you to all in the community who supported the P and C Fundraiser, where, parents are passionate about putting profits back into the school to support student learning and wellbeing. Keep an eye out for the next fundraiser I know that the P and C have great plans.

Year 11 have received their End of Course Reports as they transition into Year 12 coursework this term. Reading through the reports, they reflect students have the skills to achieve results that reflect their potential. Can I encourage all Year 11 students to read the feedback that teachers have taken the time to compose and think about how they can improve their skills in areas that will ensure growth in future assessments and examinations. Staff who teach these students have undertaken professional learning where individual student results are being evaluated and skill gaps are being identified. Staff are adjusting programs and lessons to ensure that these students can develop skills in identified areas of need as they move closer to the Higher School Certificate become experts in and skills, knowledge and understanding in all areas of the syllabus.

When high expectations are consistent across the school all classrooms reflect high levels of engagement and challenging learning opportunities.

As we are now almost halfway through a very busy term I would like to share with you that staff are engaging in professional learning, providing valuable feedback for the new school plan and really looking at how important reflective teacher practice is to provide students with lessons fostering engagement to excel. I am excited to see how the school continues to thrive with student growth and attainment, how parents develop their skills as critical partners in knowing how their students learn and can have valuable conversations with teachers, as they are the most important people to be part of student success. # Learning in MATHS



**On** Monday of Week 5, Stage 5 AES and Year 10 students will be sitting their final Mathematics examination. Students should be preparing for this examination by reviewing the topics that will be tested, practising plenty of revision questions that have been provided to them and seeking help from their teacher with any areas that require further assistance. On the day of the examination, please make sure you bring the correct equipment, which includes a pen, ruler and scientific calculator. Please see your Mathematics teacher if you require further assistance and support with your examination preparation.

During Week 5, students in Years 7 to 9 will be sitting an in-class test, which is their final assessment task for the year. Students have been working through revision questions, in class, in preparation for their test.

Students in Year 12 will be and are currently completing an assignment, which is due at the beginning of Week 7. Students will be applying what they have been learning about in class to real-life situations. Mathematics Standard 2 students will be completing an assignment on Linear Relationships and will receive this task early next week. Mathematics Advanced students have already received their assignment, which is on Discrete Probability Distributions. Please see your Mathematics teacher for further assistance with your assignments.

A friendly reminder that it is essential and expected that all students come to each and every Mathematics lesson with the correct equipment, and this includes a scientific calculator. All students in Years 7 to 12 **must** have a scientific calculator and bring it with them to every Mathematics lesson. If your child does not own a calculator, the Mathematics faculty recommends you purchase the Casio FX-82AU Plus calculator. These can be purchased from the school's front office for \$21.50.
