

Cowra High School hosted an external consultant from Headspace National during week 8 in-lieu of the postponed Life Ready Camp at Lake Burrendong. All year 11 and 12 students had the opportunity to attend session on mental health and wellbeing, self-care, resilience and the importance of support networks. Our regular rotation of assemblies, PBL sessions and Year Meetings has also continued providing Year Advisers an excellent opportunity to connect with their respective year groups and deliver tailored information and support specifically designed for each year group. Our Peer Support Program is also in full swing and receiving excellent feedback from those Year 7 students benefiting from the involvement with our Year 11 leaders, and from the leaders who are further developing their skills – a big thank you to Ms Young and her team for re-invigorating this program for our school.

Students are developing a painting inspired by bush medicine.






