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#### **!!PASS CLASS SHOWDOWN!!**

Friday 26th June our Stage 5 PASS classes competed in a cross-class challenge. Students have been learning about Technology in Sport - now they're utilising technology to fill their bodies with enough lactic acid to make their eyeballs hurt!

Two students from each of the 3 classes have been nominated to complete a 5-minute effort on a stationary bike. Their average power (in watts) will be recorded and converted into watts per kilogram of body weight. The student with the highest "watts per kilo" wins the title for their class! Students within each class were assigned different roles which included PR managers, photographers and creative designers to ensure competitors reach peak fitness, say the right thing to the media and look the part.

Bailey Callaghan for PASS C was the first contestant of the day, putting out 233 watts for 5 mins equalling 3.5 watts per kilo. A solid benchmark. He looked smooth, composed and even said he was ready to do another one. He may well have had more in the tank. PASS C looked to only have one contestant, it seemed Vye Singleton had succumbed to the pressure and would be a no-show. But, with 20 mins to spare, Vye was on the bike, still donning a pair of loose track pants, one leg rolled up to ensure not getting caught in the chain. Despite the unconventional attire, Vye put out an impressive 2.7 watts per kilo.

PASS A was the second cab off the rank. Rielly Collins stepping up to the plate. A 199-watt average meant Reilly held 34 watts less than Bailey. It seemed all was lost. But, calculations had to be made, as results were worked out off a converted watts per kilo of body weight. A nervous wait resulted in Rielly sneaking in-front, with 3.6 watts per kilo. Charlotte Smith amassed an impressive crowd of supporters during her effort. Although her three coaches were always the closest to the action, right by her handlebars as she made her way to an average of 2.3 watts per kilo. It was close across the board.

PASS B were the last class of the day. Previous classes had dismissed Josh Anslow as a threat, convinced he had impressive bike handling skills, but that his downhill mountain bike experience would just not make the cut. Not when it came to 5 mins of all out pressure on the pedals. Josh was out to prove a point. Officials had to hold the trainer on the ground as it bucked from side to side. Josh faded in and out of view, his featherweight stature meaning you had to get the right angle to see him. He held 233 watts, exactly the same as Bailey, but this mountain biker had a winning combination when it came to watts per kilo. Smashing out an obliterating 4.5 watts per kilo to claim the overall title for PASS B. Mackenzie Crook was the last rider of the day, and due to technical difficulties (Heart Rate monitor failing to record a pulse - was she flat-lining? - no - technology was playing up), she had to do a restart. Despite the set-back Mackenzie brought her focus directly back on task and finished with 2.4 watts per kilo.
