



In Year 7 Science classes the students have started studying the classification of living things. In this topic they will have an assignment on classifying living things, so stay tuned as this will be handed out in class soon.

In Year 8 Science and the Stage 4 AES classes the students are studying chemical reactions. They will be learning about the differences between physical and chemical changes, and comparing compounds to elements and mixtures.

In Year 9 Science the students are studying continental drift and plate tectonics. As a part of this module of work the students will be learning about earthquakes and volcanoes, and they will undertake an assignment on these events.

In Year 10 Science and in Stage 5 AES the students will be undertaking their Independent Research Projects (IRP). For their IRP the students have to come up with their own research project, and they then have to carry out their experiments independently, following the scientific method. The students will be expected to write a full scientific report about their experiments.

The Year 11 Physics students are completing their module on Waves and Thermodynamics. They have been undertaking experiments relating to Snell's Law. They also carried out some catch-up experiments on Newton's Laws.






In Year 12 Physics the students are learning about light and have been carrying out fun experiments like measuring the speed of light using chocolate. They also carried out Young's double slit diffraction experiment.

In Year 11 Biology the students are learning about cells. They have completed their depth study on enzymes. They recently produced yummy models of the cell membrane, as shown in the photographs.



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In Year 12 Biology the students have been studying epidemiology and non-infectious diseases. They recently completed a skills test, and should be highly commended on their results, which reflect their outstanding efforts in class. They have just started learning about the ear and how it works, and soon they will learn about the eye. The Year 12 students are also busy studying and preparing for their Trial HSC Biology Examination.

In Year 11 Chemistry the students have been studying chemical reactions, as shown in the photographs.



In Year 12 Chemistry the students have been studying analytical techniques and preparing for their Trial HSC Chemistry Exam.


In Stage 6 Agriculture the students have been studying plant production and propagation techniques.

#### **Cowra High Celebrates NAIDOC Week**

Despite the postponement of NAIDOC Week nationally until November due to Covid 19 restrictions, Cowra High's celebrations continued as planned last week.

The week's highlighted event took place on Friday with the unveiling of a metal sculpture and garden on Cowra High's front lawn featuring this year's NAIDOC theme "Always Was, Always Will Be." Wiradjuri land and Indigenous dance performances.

The 2020 theme recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for more than 65,000 years and our Cultural Youth Worker, Jared Burns, spoke of the significance that Country plays to Indigenous cultures, physically, emotionally and spiritually.

Cowra High's Wagambirra Dance Group and Dinawan's Connection combined to perform a smoking ceremony, a variety of traditional dances and Michaela Jeffries choreographed a contemporary number for the invited guests, staff and student body in attendance.

A cake reflecting the three sculpture panels was served, together with a sausage sizzle and some kangaroo tasters. During the course of the week in PE lessons, Jared and Mr Dean Murray (Regional Aboriginal Community Liaison Officer) introduced some Traditional Indigenous Games to students and staff, further enhancing cultural awareness and inclusivity. We thank all those who contributed to the week and all attendees for their respectful observance of this special occasion.

#### How to help your child get a Tax File Number



Any student will need at tax file number if they start work (part-time and full-time or casual) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they will be requested to provide their Tax File Number (TFN) on enrolment to TAFE or university next year, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.
