It provides information about how well students understand Science concepts and skills over a two-year period. The Science faculty look forward to reflecting on these evidence sets to improve teaching and learning practices.

Our School P and C met last week and I would like to thank them for donating a water filter for students to use, particularly now as we move towards the summer months in Cowra. This will provide students with filtered water and ease of filling their water bottles. Many thanks to the CHS P and C, your support of this proposal is very much appreciated.

Deputy Principal - Wellbeing Report

As Week 8 draws to a close it is abundantly obvious to all of us here at Cowra high School just how busy Term 3 has been. Our HSC students now move into completing the last of their face-to-face studies and prepare for their exams and our Preliminary students sit their yearly course exams over the coming fortnight. We wish both of these groups and their families the very best at this time and again encourage all involved to make use of any of our comprehensive support staff available at this time as necessary.

We are finally beginning to enjoy warmer weather conditions with the onset of Spring, and as such I would like to draw your attention to the school summer uniform. Details of appropriate summer uniform for all students are available on the school website and as always, we continue to encourage all students to remain in full school uniform. Please ensure you are familiar with our uniform requirements and if you require any further clarification or assistance in ensuring your child has the correct uniform for school, please contact the front office; the school is very happy to help.

The School Wellbeing Team would also like to welcome our newest permanent member of staff, India Wilcox, who joins us as our fulltime Student Support Officer (SSO). We have had the pleasure of working with India in two previous roles within the school and look forward to continuing to employ her wide range of skills to the role of SSO as we continue to cater the diverse needs of all students and families of Cowra High School.

A final important note regarding attendance. Our regular meetings and monitoring processes around student attendance show the need to remind students and their families of the importance of maintaining the highest possible level of school attendance. Our current data shows an unfortunate increase in absenteeism across year groups, and particularly absences of an unexplained and/or unjustified nature. All school days and school occasions are compulsory and student attendance, on time, is expected daily. If a student is unable to attend for any reason this needs to be communicated to the school clerical office as soon as possible. All appointments are encouraged to be made outside of normal school hours to minimise the disruption to important face-to-face teaching and learning time. It is important to remember that even if a student maintains a very high level of attendance at school throughout their 13 years of formal schooling, even a student with 90% attendance still misses a year of formal schooling as a result of their 10% absence over this period of time... Important food for thought.

Keeping Up-To-Date

HSC READER, WRITERS REQUIRED FOR 2020

Cowra High School is asking for expressions of interest from community volunteers for the positions of reader, writers to assist students completing their HSC, October, November 2020. As a reader, writer you will be reading the examination to the student and writing word for word their responses to the questions. NESA regulations state that you cannot be a relative of a student completing the HSC in 2020. To be a reader, writer you are required to have a Working with Children's Check number. This is easily completed online plus it is free as you're volunteering for the school. The Learning and Support staff at the school can assist with this process.



I have had so many interesting and exciting conversations with our senior students and Year 10 students this term. Students are really putting thought into their potential careers and are very open to exploring the many pathways.

I attended a webinar earlier this week conducted by CICA about 'Improving the employment prospects of young people'. COVID 19 is having a significant impact on the labour market as we all know, in short, the job market is more competitive than it has ever been at present. Some industries have been impacted more than others, especially in accommodation and food services, retail, tourism and the arts. Young people especially have been more affected than other groups because many are employed as casuals and work in industries most impacted. Resilience and adaptability will be crucial skills for students to learn during this period. There will be a period of uncertainty before the new normal arrives.
