





They have an assortment of vegetables growing including carrots, lettuce and tomatoes. We were excited to receive some Aboriginal bush food seeds which will be our next gardening




Mr Hopson and Mrs Crosher have been working with Delta class to produce some Aboriginal inspired art.


RDA has started for the year. Everyone had a great first day!

Year 8 science learning about diffusion in hot and cold water. They are studying mixtures and have just learnt that dissolving and diffusion are two ways to make mixtures.










### Junior Boys Cricket vs Blayney HS


