


Cricket

CKC Sporting / Cultural Competition



15 Cowra High students took part in the Western Region Athletics Trials in Dubbo on the 5th August. Heavy rain leading into the event had some worried of postponement. However, the state of the art facility drained well and the trials went ahead. The rain did, however, cause multiple road closures. Students, thrown in the deep end and acting as navigators on the trip across from Cowra. It was high-pressure. Poor navigation skills could result in students not making it on time, or arriving safely to the gates of a large paddock instead of Barden Park, Dubbo. Fortunately, their skills were on point, and everyone arrived on time and to the correct location.

An online results system was to be trialled on the day. Unfortunately, it didn't manage to get off the ground. Instead, results were printed off, and stuck to the stadium walls. If navigation was the first challenge of the day — competition was the second — and getting a glimpse at the results sheet, the third. Students needed to jostle for position. Then hold position until they could find their event, find their name and snap a quick photo. It was a rewarding experience though. 7 of our students seeing they had gained selection into the the Western Region Athletics Team. These students will compete at the NSW Combined High Schools Secondary Athletics Championships.




The Western Region Academy of Sport's 2022 Netball athlete of the Year!






YEAR 11 VISUAL ARTS

YEAR 12 ENGLISH WORKSHOP


Year 12 were lucky enough to have a workshop on English Paper One.

NSW SCHOOLS CUP

On the hallowed grounds of Col Stinson Park, with Bellevue Hill providing the scenic backdrop, the Cowra High School Boys Netball Team began their campaign, contesting the first round of the 2022 NSW Schools Cup competition. In their first game, Cowra were able to play something of a warm-up match against each other, affording Coach India Wilcox the opportunity to assess her charges playing strengths. The team looked sharp and went about readying themselves for what lie ahead.

In their next match Cowra High faced Canowindra High School, quickly establishing an early lead that would not be challenged. In the first half, Blake Sandry demanded a greater piece of the action. Coach Josh Weston gave Sandry that opportunity, moving him from keeper into the midfield where he did not disappoint. Lucas Cayfe and Mitchell Cartwright defended well all game, while Noah Keen proved lethal in attack. Daniel Bakini demonstrated his versatility on the offensive and defensive ends, scoring goals and shutting down the Canowindra attack. In the end, Cowra High took-out the match with a convincing 13 to 4 victory.

In the decider, Cowra High faced the might of St Raphs in an arm wrestle that would see the teams go to the half-time break drawn at 7 all. In a master stroke, Coach Indy rearranged the pieces, moving Finn Hamer into Cowra's last line of defence under the hoop. He and Aaron Hall went about shutting down the St Raph's offence, restricting them to only 2 goals in the second half. While at the other end of the court, Lucas McKenzie and Jacob Graham continued to shoot the lights out, raising their intensity levels to meet the challenge. The pin-point passes and lightening quick speed of wingers Roderick Le and McKay Sullivan turned out far too effective against their bedazzled opposition. While Ky Garrett proved instrumental at centre, demonstrating the leadership qualities necessary to get the team firing on all cylinders. When the dust had settled, it was Cowra High who reigned supreme, outscoring St Raphs 10 goals to 2 in the second half to take a 17 to 9 victory.

Cowra High School will journey to the winter wonderland city of Orange where they will contest the next round of the NSW Schools Cup competition. There they will face the Western Region powerhouses, and a possible showdown against defending champions Dubbo High School, for the opportunity to represent at the NSW Schools Cup finals in Sydney......













COWRA BREAKOUT 78TH ANNIVERSARY

Friday 5th August 2022 marked the 78th anniversary of the Cowra POW Breakout during World War 2.

Cowra High School was represented and participated in the memorial service held at 10 am and attended by a wide variety of individuals ranging from the Japanese Ambassador to Australia and his wife, along with other Japanese military and embassy officials to local government and Federal representatives.

The service consisted of wreath laying ceremonies in both the Australian and Japanese war cemeteries, along with a Buddhist service in the latter.

Cowra High School Captains and Vice Captains laid wreaths representing the school, the Seikei Student Exchange program and Seikei High School who were represented by the two exchange students Aya Higashi and Koh Kimura, who also participated in the wreath laying duties on behalf of their school.

The memorial service also involved a cemetery honour guard from the Cowra Army Cadets, many of whom are Cowra High School students. The service was also covered not only by Australian news services, but the Japanese national broadcaster, who covered both the service and filmed at Cowra High School, documenting the event and more to create a story on the events and the relationship between old enemies today.

It was a special day that reminds us not only about the special relationship between Cowra and Japan, but the healing that has taken place over the decades and how we should view the impact and meaning of peace born out of conflict.



The Premier's Debating Challenge

On Wednesday 17 August, Cowra High School's Junior Debating Team participated in The Premier's Debating Challenge for 2022. Designed to take place over several weeks, the schools from Cowra's division elected to participate in a Zoom-based 'Great Debating Day' and complete all rounds at once.

Our first debate, against Henry Lawson High School's A Team, pondered the question of whether parents should bribe their children to stay off social media. Cowra's team, made up of Felicity Smith, AJ Del Rosario, Marley Brown-Bartolo and Sarah Curtis, mounted a fearsome argument in favour of staying off social media, however, they didn't adequately address the 'bribery' component, resulting in a win for the opposition. At this stage, they were 'rewarded' with pizza, giving them the opportunity to reflect on the power of words and their associations.

Our second debate was against Henry Lawson High School's B Team. Chairperson AJ clapped enthusiastically with the members of Cowra's team for their opposition's success, after which I made sure to let them know that kindness is pretty awesome, wherever your marks may sit.

Our team performed magnificently and, while they didn't come away with a win, the students were winners when it came to the feedback and experience they received. They are to be congratulated for their preparedness to stand up and speak in front of others, often improvising on the spot, and for their sportsmanship towards the opposing teams.










Cowra High Careers has been loving more hands-on workshops and excursions available for students to attend. Two years sometimes feels like forever since we have been able to get out and about. Students have embraced these opportunities whole-heartly which has been pleasing. Exploring career pathways does require effort and a lot of self-learning and reflection. While it may be an employee's market at present, it is important that students have the tools to make educated decisions that reflect their long term goals.

Year 9 students were again offered the opportunity to check out CSU's Bathurst campus this term and see what exciting things it has to offer in tertiary studies as part of CSU's Future Direction program. They explored workshops in communication, criminal justice and law, teaching and education, health heroes, paramedicine and psychology.

Year 10 have been chatting to me about their career plans as well as discussing their potential pattern of study in 2023. It's important to ensure that their subject choices align with their future career plans as best as they can at this stage.

Very much hoping Year 12 have now all applied for any early entry opportunities at university that they are keen to study further education after their HSC. 
