Principal's Message

Dear Cowra High School parents and community members,

Welcome back to Term Two at Cowra High School. Staff Development Day saw Cowra High School staff working collaboratively with the focus as always on ensuring high standards of teaching and learning for all students. Year 12 return with two terms to go and Year 11 are continuing to steadily work towards completing assessments. NAPLAN has been a focus for Years 7 and 9 and Years 8 and 10 will be working on skill gaps in the classroom around reading and numeracy based on their 'Check In' assessment. A rigorous term for all as well as preparing for the Camden sporting exchange which this year is to be held in Camden, from 1-3 June.

At the Anzac Day Ceremony held in Cowra, our leadership team represented Cowra High School proudly. Thank you to all students and staff who marched in remembrance of the anniversary of the day when Australian and New Zealand soldiers landed on Gallipoli in 1915 as part of the Allies' invasion. The collaboration of the families involved with Cowra High, our partner primary schools, and so many community groups and organisations was outstanding as we reflected and remembered those soldiers.

Reconciliation Australia's theme for 2022, "Be Brave. Make Change." is a challenge to all Australians — individuals, families, communities, organisations, and government — to be brave and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation to improve the lives of all Australians. On Sorry Day at Cowra High School Gary Cheng shared with staff and students, mentored by Aunty Robyn Coffey, the importance of reminding ourselves of the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as well as those who were forcibly removed from their families. Staff at Cowra High School in classrooms took a moment to share the history and link it to their lessons to remember and understand the purpose of Sorry Day and those in our community who have family and extended family that experienced the government's decisions under the assimilation policy.

Cowra High School hosted Luke Carroll who shared his experiences growing up with our school community, Mulyan Public School, Cowra Public School, and Carinya Preschool. Luke is a Wiradjuri man who grew up off country on Gadigal land. Luke spoke to our students about the value of education and the importance of seizing every opportunity that presents itself, even if initially there are emotions of feeling shy or nervous about receiving an award or recognition. The assembly was then opened up to a Q and A with students asking some interesting questions and Luke receiving some 'ribbing' about his beloved South Sydney Rabbitohs where he spoke about being an ambassador for the club.








Young Archie Competition - Cowra Regional Gallery









Cowra Regional Gallery visit - The Archibald





Language Learning Levels-Up at Cowra

Cowra High School students have started a new stage of modern language learning through the "gamification" of vocabulary and script. Students have been carefully considering kanji meanings and studying the various vocabulary in all stages of the Japanese course through the online learning platform Gimkit. Initial playthroughs have all returned the same result – it's a fun new way to fight these kanji bosses of Japanese language learning and the perfect power-up to expanding Japanese vocabulary.

"Gamification" as a term is relatively new to the world of education, though it has been used for a long period of time in the business world. It refers to the way of engaging an audience to participate, collaborate, share and interact using tools of video games, such as power-ups, abilities and game currency. Students are asked questions about vocabulary and kanji, the more difficult characters in Japanese that comes from China, then they must answer correctly in order to access the "game" parts of the program. The more they answer, and the longer their correct answer streak goes for, the more they can engage with the game side of the program. It's a system that rewards students for studying these trickier and often boring parts of the language.

One anonymous student in the Stage 5 course had this to say. "It's great! Not only is it a better way to learn kanji, which I find tricky, but if I get to 50 correct answers in a row, I get a bonus! Of course, that's if my friends don't blur my screen to make it harder. After practicing, I can now tell which kanji it is, even if my screen is blurred!"

Students have had the chance to beta-test the program and as the previous testimony shows, it's a level clear. All levels of Japanese have implemented it as homework and students are encouraged to login to their Japanese google classroom, upgrade their understanding of kanji and vocabulary to become a Japanese language learning master. Gotta' learn em all!



STUDENTS GROW WITH THEIR LAMB STUDIES

Agricultural students at Cowra High will be learning how to finish prime lambs for sale thanks to Cowra's farming community and businesses.

Year 9 and 10 students at the school studied the growth of lambs in a trial last year after Cowra's Jo Treasure sourced lambs for the school from two local farms.

Ms Treasure is again sourcing lambs for the school this year after securing 16 last year with Cowra High Ag Studies teacher Clint Cole confirming the school will be doing a lamb growth trial again this year.

Eight of last year's lambs were donated by her father Brett and eight from another farmer, Ross Graham and his family

Last year's program involved the students developing a green ration for the lambs and then feeding them every day.

At the end of the trial the lambs were purchased by Cowra's Breakout River Meats.

"Quite a few local businesses donated a lot of things," Ms Treasure said.

Other generous donors included Peter Boyd of Boyd Metalworks which donated a sheep feeder, to the value of around \$2,000; Alex Webster (local Young farmer) who donated over a tonne of grain in Bulka Bags, which he also supplied himself; Ray Wallace, of Cowra Seed and Grain, who cracked the Lupins which Alex donated, for free; Lachlan Fertilisers Cowra which donated additives and buffers.

Coprice reached out to offer their support and the Watt family donated a set of scales to the High School to measure the lambs' growth.





Helping Teens Manage Emotions & Relationship Problems seeking participants for group therapy programs trial






Calling for families: Trial of programs for teenagers experiencing peer problems




